CATALOG DESCRIPTION: An exploration of two applications, Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator. These programs enable designers to create and manipulate digital images and incorporate them into publications quickly and easily. Both programs are explored in depth as students learn their capabilities through demonstrations and assignments. Adobe Photoshop allows designers to perform extremely sophisticated digital manipulation of scanned photographic images. Using Photoshop, graphic artist can retouch, modify, clone and paint scanned photographs. With Adobe Illustrator students learn the skill to create illustrations electronically and the freedom to manipulate images with ease. Students also learn how to combine digital images with text.

COURSE CONTENT:

Adobe Photoshop allows designers and illustrators to perform extremely sophisticated manipulation of digital photographic images. Photoshop can also be used for color correction, scanning, mode conversions and many complex design-related effects.

Adobe Illustrator is the industry standard for digital illustration. Using this program, students learn how to create images and illustrations with ease. Students will learn to manipulate line and blend colors seamlessly. This software offers designers precise controls with the placement of objects that help in creating photorealistic illustrations.
