- 1. To demonstrate comprehension of basic grammatical structures.
- 2. To demonstrate speaking proficiency using basic grammatical structures.
- 3. To demonstrate writing proficiency using basic grammatical structures.

PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES:

- A. Recognition: Students will be able to
 - 1. Identify grammatical structures using conventional grammatical terminology (e.g.: present progressive tense, auxiliary verb, present participle, uncountable noun).
 - 2. Identify and label discrete grammatical items in written sentences as either correctly or incorrectly used .(e.g.; He *drived* an old car.=*Incorrect verb* .)
 - 3. Identify common grammatical errors in speech samples.(e.g.; We go shop yesterday.
 - = "go shop" is incorrect in verb tense and form.)
- B. Production: Students will be able to
 - 1. Respond to listening and reading materials and demonstrate the ability to complete sentences, ask and answer questions, paraphrase, fill in the blanks, and compose original sentences in both speaking and writing.
 - 2. Retell a story with guidance, and show control of suffixes and inflections.
 - 3. Take dictations based on listening and reading materials.
