COURSE NUMBER: ESL* 135

COURSE DESCRIPTION: An intensive language course for nonnative students who want to develop competency in the use of intermediate grammatical structures in practical and academic contexts. The course provides students the opportunity to learn these structures through daily reading and language analysis exercises, speaking and writing practice.

Course Specific Objectives:

- 1. To demonstrate comprehension of intermediate grammatical structures.
- 2. To demonstrate speaking proficiency using intermediate grammatical structures.
- 3. To demonstrate writing proficiency using intermediate grammatical structures.

PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES:

- A. Recognition: Students will be able to
 - 1. Identify grammatical structures using conventional terminology(e.g. past participle, active voice, gerund).
 - 2. Identify and label discrete grammatical items in written sentences as either correctly or incorrectly used (e.g., We enjoyed *to see* you .= incorrect verb form).
 - 3. Identify common grammatical errors in speech samples. (e.g., They avoid to talk to their boss.. = "to talk" is incorrect in verb form; the gerund form should be used.)
- B Production: Students will be able to
 - Respond to listening and reading materials and demonstrates the ability
 to complete sentences, ask and answer questions, paraphrase, fill in the
 blanks, and compose original sentences in both speaking and writing, i.e.,
 dialogues and paragraphs.
 - 2. Retell a story, with guidance, and show control of suffixes and inflections.
 - 3. Take dictations based on listening and reading materials.
