CATALOG DESCRIPTION: The Cooperative Education Internship affords students the opportunity to build on their classroom studies in an environment that focuses on professional development. Students select an internship host company that offers the opportunity to develop skills in a field related to their study in studio art/graphic design, including corporate in house design, publishing, freelance design, newspapers and design agencies as well as related positions in other industry. Students will attend a preparatory class for the first week of the term and meet on-line each week. Students are required to work a total of 120 hours during the term at a host company.

Apply classroom learning to work situations that focus on core competencies.

Develop interpersonal skills.

Develop stress and time management skills.

Develop technical skills.

Identify and learn to address issues of harassment in the work place.

Learn time management and personal responsibility.

Identify personal, educational and career objectives.

Develop professional portfolio work.

Keep a journal and utilize its information along with course information to prepare an analytical paper focus on learning that transpired during the internship.
